St. Ignatius, Disciple of St. John

In considering topics for a weekly bulletin-front reflection, I often look to the Church calendar to see what holy days or saints' feast days occur during the coming week so that I can share some Godly wisdom with you. After all. these men and women have attained THE supreme goal, Heaven. So, we can learn much from them as we continue our earthly pilgrimage, hoping to be with them one day in our Father's kingdom.

Well, I think we struck spiritual gold for this week as we celebrate the Memorial of a first-century saint and martyr, St. Ignatius of Antioch on October 17. Our saint lived from around A.D. 35 to 107 and is believed to have been a disciple of St. John the Apostle. In an effort to save space for his wisdom, I will close with just one more comment.

May these quotes of this Godly man help to strengthen our faith and increase our gratitude for the tremendous gift of our Catholic faith. -Fr. Michael

- * I am writing to all the Churches and I enjoin all, that I am dying willingly for God's sake, if only you do not prevent it. I beg you, do not do me an untimely kindness. Allow me to be eaten by the beasts, which are my way of reaching to God. I am God's wheat, and I am to be ground by the teeth of wild beasts, so that I may become the pure bread of Christ.
- * It is impossible for a man to be freed from the habit of sin before he hates it, just as it is impossible to receive forgiveness before confessing his trespasses.
- * No earthly pleasures, no kingdoms of this world can benefit me in any way. I prefer death in Christ Jesus to power over the farthest limits of the earth. He who died in place of us is the one object of my quest. He who rose for our sakes is my one desire. Do not talk about Jesus Christ as long as you love this world.
- * A Christian is not his own master, since all his time belongs to God.
- * Our task is not one of producing persuasive propaganda; Christianity shows its greatness when it is hated by the world.
- * Take note of those who hold heterodox opinions on the grace of Jesus Christ which has come to us, and see how contrary their opinions are to the mind of God. . . . They abstain from the Eucharist and from prayer because they do not confess that the Eucharist is the flesh of our Savior Jesus Christ, flesh which suffered for our sins and which that Father, in his goodness, raised up again. They who deny the gift of God are perishing in their disputes.
- * Pray without ceasing on behalf of other men...For cannot he that falls rise again?
- * It is not that I want merely to be called a Christian, but actually to be one. Yes, if I prove to be one, then I can have the name.

This last quote, dating from the first or second century, is believed to be the earliest reference to the fact that the early Church was "Catholic", i.e., from the Greek, katholikos, universal.

* Wherever the bishop shall appear, there let the multitude of the people also be; even as wherever Jesus Christ is, there is the Catholic Church.
