October 22, 2023 29th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Repay to Caesar what belongs to Caesar and to God what belongs to God. (Mt. 22:21b)

The list of Scripture passages that touch my heart and mind continues to grow. I hope that's the case for you too. Some passages challenge me more than others. With that in mind, please permit me to share such a passage with you because while this pertains specifically to the clergy, its truth affects all of us.

Thus the word of the Lord came to me: Son of man, I have appointed you a watchman for the house of Israel. When you hear a word from my mouth, you shall warn them for me. If I say to the wicked man, You shall surely die; and you do not warn him or speak out to dissuade him from his wicked conduct so that he may live: that wicked man shall die for his sin, but I will hold you responsible for his death. If, on the other hand, you have warned the wicked man, yet he has not turned away from his evil nor from his wicked conduct, then he shall die for his sin, but you shall save your life. If a virtuous man turns away from virtue and does wrong when I place a stumbling block before him, he shall die. He shall die for his sin, and his virtuous deeds shall not be remembered; but I will hold you responsible for his death if you did not warn him. When, on the other hand, you have warned a virtuous man not to sin, and he has in fact not sinned, he shall surely live because of the warning, and you shall save your own life. (Ezekiel 3:17-21) To say that that passage now makes me think is a huge understatement. It should make all the ordained stop and think and examine, am I dropping the ball and if so, in what ways?

So, why at this time do I bring the quote from Ezekiel to this reflection this weekend when our Gospel passage today reminds us of these very familiar words: *Repay to Caesar what belongs to Caesar and to God what belongs to God?*

I convict myself of failing to "warn," failing to touch upon topics that are considered controversial in our day and age, topics which the Catholic Church teaches as truth, as part of natural law, *applicable to every person*. God's *truth* or Caesar's "truth?" Unfortunately, Caesar, and many in our governments and in our modern culture, teach and preach something else with clarity - moral relativism. Basically, do whatever you feel like doing. What's right for you is right for you. What's right for me is right for me, even if our beliefs differ. I do whatever I feel like doing. Mind your own business.

So, all that being said, I will now touch upon just 3 countercultural, eternal teachings of the Church. Then, I will ask each of us to decide on these three topics: obedience to God or to Caesar. As we consider our decisions on each of these topics, please remember that we will have to give an account at our Judgment for what we've done and what we've failed to do in our brief life on earth. Fact: We sin whenever we support sin. We, intentionally or not, can become accomplices to disobedience to God, and that is never the wise choice.

Do the following belong to God or to Caesar? Does God have anything, anything at all to say about the following?

- * Who is the giver of life, the author of life, God or Caesar/Supreme Court/popular opinion? Abortion, assisted suicide, euthanasia/"mercy killing", et al.
- * Who is the author of marriage, the one who defines what marriage is, God or Caesar/Supreme Court/popular opinion? Any two consenting adults may marry? Why just limit it to two? Who determines?
- * Male & female? Who is the author of human nature, who decides? God or Caesar/Supreme Court/popular opinion? The way I feel determines who I am?! Feelings matter more than biology/reality? In each of these and other truths, we must consider what is pleasing to God and then, do that.

Is this hateful of people? Actually, it's just the opposite. It's love of God and love of neighbor, especially when we consider the passage from Ezekiel. Considering the truth in that passage from Ezekiel, it is an authentic work of **charity** to remind us of the present and **etemal** consequences of our actions, dreadful if left unrepentant. Authentic love seeks the good of the other, here-and-now and the primary good - our eternal destiny, Heaven or Hell.

My watchmen are all dumb dogs, they cannot bark. (Isaiah 56:10) I no longer want to be God's dumb dog. And so, today I bark, for love of God, neighbor, and self, proclaiming God's wisdom and love for all of us, as He reminds every person to choose Him and His wisdom and truth above all else.

At the end of our brief pilgrimage on earth, we will have to give an account of our lives. Will we do so to our friends, to our media, to public opinion, to the Supreme Court in D.C.? Of course not. However, every person has or will one day stand before the ultimate and final "SUPREME COURT," our merciful and **just** Judge, our Lord, Jesus. We should prepare for that moment, and may we be found pleasing in His sight when that inevitable day arrives.


