The Month of November in the Church

I can't speak for other faiths, but I can and will speak boldly about our Catholic faith even if what I say sounds strange to some ears. That being said, one of the strengths of our faith, one thing that some might see as odd, is her reminding us of a most important truth, reminding us of our mortality, both in the Bible readings at Mass and on our calendar, for example, Ash Wednesday.

This week we enter the last month in our Church calendar, with the new year, Advent, arriving on Sunday, December 3. Coming to an end of a period of time, one Church year, the Church takes this opportunity, the month of November, to remind us to pray for the Holy Souls in Purgatory and to remind us of the Four Last Things.

Praying for the Holy Souls - on the Existence of Purgatory

The Church teaches us in the Catechism, in #1030: All who die in God's grace and friendship, but still imperfectly purified, are indeed assured of their eternal salvation; but after death they undergo purification, so as to achieve the holiness necessary to enter the joy of heaven. It's a process of final purification, not a second chance to repent.

All the Holy Souls are assured of their salvation. They died with no mortal sins on their souls and will spend eternity in Our Lord's kingdom. However, those souls are in need of further cleansing, *...nothing unclean will enter Heaven* (Rev. 21:27), zero flaws. We can help them attain Heaven asap with our prayers, almsgiving, and acts of penance (#1032). Praying for the repose of the Holy Souls is one of the 7 Spiritual Works of Mercy. "Let us not hesitate to help those who have died and to offer our prayers for them." -St. John Chrysostom, (347-407 AD) <--- proof that this is an ancient teaching of the Church

Recalling the Reality of the Four Last Things

Speaking for myself and for others, there have been times in my life when I was so caught up in worldly, fleeting pursuits that I failed to remember that our life on earth is very short, compared to eternity, and we will have to give account of our lives. Since this failure to remember is not at all unheard of, the Church, out of concern for our immortal souls, for our eternal destination, takes this opportunity near the tail end of the Church year to remind us of what awaits every person in the, admit it, not-too-distant future, Four Last Things: Death, Judgment, Heaven, Hell. Every person who has lived or will live will experience three of these four: 1) death (good heavens, even atheists acknowledge this), 2) judgment by Our Lord Jesus, 3) eternity either in Heaven or in Hell. I suspect that some will deny this teaching, and attempt to ignore it. However, the desire to live resides in every person's heart. *He has put the timeless into their hearts*. (Ecclesiastes 3:11) So, where do we go with that reality? The only sensible answer to that is "to Jesus."

Jesus Himself reminds us of the Four Last Things in several places in the Gospels, especially in Matthew 25. This chapter will be proclaimed on the last three Sundays in November. One quick sample from Our Lord Himself: *Stay awake, for you know neither the day nor the hour* (Mt. 25:13).


Daylight Savings Time ends November 5, at 2:00 am. Remember to set your clocks back 1 hour before you go to bed.
