Mind Our Own Business?

I must preface this reflection by admitting that I am no scholar of the U.S. Constitution. So, I am willing to stand corrected, if, *IF* it can be proven that what I write below is wrong.

No doubt that most of us have heard the expression "Separation of Church and State." What does that mean? Is that expression (no!) or even that concept (if so, where?) included in our nation's Constitution?

I believe that the closest that the U.S. Constitution comes to stating that concept is the First Amendment, which states with regard to religion: *Congress shall make no law respecting an establishment of religion.* or prohibiting the free exercise thereof.

Sounds pretty clear to me. Most of our nation's founders or their ancestors arrived on our shores from England, where there was and is a State church, the Church of England. Some faiths, including Catholics, faced serious persecution in England. So, our Founding Fathers learned from experience that the State doesn't do very well in *establishing a religion* for all the people of a nation. State-established religions tend to suppress or even persecute other religions. Such situations exist even to this day. Therefore, I wholeheartedly embrace the First Amendment. What I wholeheartedly reject are its misapplications to our daily life.

Some people, often the loudest, demand that we leave our religion inside the church building. People of faith, especially Christians, are basically told to mind our own business, often with the spurious mantra of "separation of church and state," "separation of church and state," ad nauseum.

All people bring their values into daily life, including into the voting booth. Atheists bring their values into daily life and into the voting booth. They have the freedom to do so. Catholics, other Christians, and men and women of goodwill must keep our values to ourselves? Wrong. We too have the Godgiven freedom to bring our values into the world and into the voting booth, and as baptized Catholics our values are formed by our Catholic faith, not by opinion polls.

My understanding is that the Church may not endorse one candidate over another. So, I endorse no one in this reflection. Here I address voting on the proposed amendments to the Colorado constitution: 79 (life), 80 (school choice), and J (marriage).

For love of God & for love of neighbor, for the overall good of our nation, let us vote with a well-formed Catholic conscience, formed not only by Church teaching (applicable to Catholics), but also informed by Natural Law (applicable to all people), the Law imprinted on every human heart.

Fellow Catholics and all men and women of goodwill, let us bring our values into the public square, and into our daily lives, and into the voting booth.

May Christ shine through us, for love of self and for love of neighbor. Invite Jesus into our daily lives and into the voting booth, especially as we vote on these proposed amendments to the Colorado constitution: proposed amendments - 79 (No), 80 (Yes), and J (No). -Fr Michael

God bless you and may He heal our nation.
