Stay Awake - the Four Last Things

Therefore, stay awake, for you know neither the day nor the hour. (Mt 25:13)

The Four Last Things: Death, Judgment, Heaven, Hell. Every November, as we rapidly approach the end of the Church year, the Church, as a loving Mother, reminds us of this reality, of our mortality and what lies beyond that. 
