PERSISTENCE AND CONSISTENCY IN PRAYER

My brothers and sisters in Christ, we know that it may be easy to be proud of our faith when things are convenient to us, rather that when life presents challenges. We have been hearing during the last two weeks from the readings of the Holy Mass, the word of God inviting us to persistence in prayer, an invitation to show our sincere love for God. Fidelity is the ultimate expression of sincerity. So, if we love God, we shall always strive to be faithful to Him, because He is always faithful to us. Saint Paul, in his letter to Timothy (2 Tim, 2:13) reminds us of the faithful nature of God when he says that God doesn't change because of our infidelity to Him.

Persistence is a key aspect of faith and prayer, essential for enduring life's difficulties and growing spiritually, whether it's convenient or inconvenient. We should always ask ourselves, "Am I able to remain firm in faith when things are not working my way?"

Don't be weary in prayer; keep at it; watch for God's answers

Last week, the 29th Sunday of the ordinary time, Jesus presented to us the parable of the persistent widow and the Judge who neither feared God nor men. With this parable, Jesus, with His divine wisdom, intended to awaken in us two profound truths about our human nature (the fragility of our own human nature). We cannot do it all by ourselves. We need God's assistance and therefore, we should never be embarrassed to knock at God's door again and again.

Let us knock at God's door. If it's not open, let's knock harder. We cannot just ask once and get discouraged because we have not received the expected answer immediately. There is a reason as to why God is making us wait. Prayer must be accompanied by the virtue of patience, (faith that insists, that cries out, that does not tire of waiting, even when God's silence seems longer).

The widow of the parable reminds us of the many times in our lives, wounded by pain, suffering injustice but we continue praying. This manifests courage and a steadfast heart rooted in faith and love, reflecting the faithful love of God.

Our Persistence in prayer is not a projection of stubbornness

Of course, we keep on praying because we believe God is listening and will grant us our needs. It's a manifestation that the righteous judge, who is God, listens, welcomes and acts in our favor, at the right time. Perseverance in prayer is the link that takes us to the heart of God, it is in it that we find solace, strength and light to keep walking. We should also ask ourselves, "Can I remain faithful even when heaven seems silent? "Can I continue to pray even when tears are my only words?" Prayer is a challenge that requires perseverance and consistency, especially when one is faced with distractions or spiritual dryness. We need to keep walking, even when prayer seems to yield no immediate results.

How well do we persist in living a prayerful life, a life of justice and charity, especially when circumstances make it difficult?

Of course, persistence in prayer is not just about the quantity of words we use, the number of times we pray or the length of our prayer life but it's about actively persevering in goodness, service, even when facing challenges or feeling spiritual dryness. When we pray, we also need to play our part and allow the Holy Spirit to take control of our life. Our prayer life should transform our ways; relations both with God and our brothers.

May we be persistent and constant in prayer, and confident in Divine justice. Our faith should never be weakened before the "silence" of God but grow in the certainty that He always hears us and will never abandon us who trust in Him.


